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ALL IN for 2024

As 2023 comes to an end, I find myself thinking about how much can change in 12 months.

One year ago, I was submitting my student's grades for the final time while trying to run Angels for Change and prepping for the holidays with family. I simply could not run at the pace needed to be both Chief Change Maker and Adjunct Professor. So, we took a leap of faith that donations would continue and I quit working at my college. We went "ALL IN", replacing my adjunct professor paycheck from funds raised and donated to A4C.

In January when the semester started without me, I admit I truly felt the change. Since 2004 meeting new students and starting new courses had been a consistent through all major life changes; pregnancies, births, moves, illness, hospital stays, and the launch of A4C.

During those early founding days, I spent many office hours chatting with my fellow business department colleagues about the unique economics of this supply chain and sharing our successes and failures as real-life case studies with my students. Yet, to achieve our mission of ending drug shortages, my time and focus could no longer be divided. I had to put a pause on that chapter.

With this change, I found new freedoms to say yes to travel opportunities and collaborations. And travel I did! I am very proud of the amount of awareness, action, and impact our Change Maker work and message has received this year.

12 months ago, I had only traveled to speak and been interviewed a few times, very few policy members knew about drug shortages or our work, and our reach to patients and facilities was fairly small. But with each article published and every speaking engagement more patients learned of our work, reaching out for help, and more Change Makers joined in the race.

The list of achievements of this year sometimes overwhelms me; White House visits, Congressional testimony, policy work, national interviews and profiles, a sold out SummitONE, scaling project PROTECT 4 times, keynote speaker invitations, building our Inventory Sharing Network, and supporting patients nationwide, to name a few.

4 years ago, I just wanted my daughter to live. Now, I spend my days making sure all US citizens live (learn about 4 of them in this issue) and building the supply chain they all deserve. It truly is amazing what can be accomplished in 12 months when you go "ALL IN". Imagine what we will achieve in the next 12 months. Who is "ALL IN" with me?

Every drug shortage has warriors every warrior has a story. Today we share the story of Michael Thompson, a Shortage Warrior from Ankeny, Iowa. Michael had a recurring, minor throat irritation and earache which led to his diagnosis of cancer. When he went in for his second round of induction therapy, he was told his most critical chemotherapy drug for his treatment plan was not available due to a shortage. "I don't need to be a doctor to realize that even the best doctors can't provide me with the best care if they don't have access to the necessary chemotherapy drugs." wrote Michael.
